Hon. Mark F. Weaver, Program Chair/CLE Committee Member is the presiding justice at the 10th Circuit Court in Brentwood, NH sitting in the Probate, District and Family Divisions of the Court. He earned his B.A. from Bates College in 1980 and his J.D. from Boston College in 1984. From 1984-2012, Judge Weaver was in private practice, concentrating in the areas of commercial litigation, collections, bankruptcy and commercial law. He was also a special justice to the Hampton District Court from 2005 to 2012 part time, until he was appointed to a full time position. Judge Weaver is a long-time member of the NHBA•CLE Committee, and was its chair from 2013-2015. Judge Weaver has participated in the NHBA Law Related Education program's "A Lawyer and Judge in Every School" event several times over the years.

Brigette Siff Holmes is an administrator for the NH Circuit Court. She earned her B.A. from the University of Virginia and her J.D. from Golden Gate University School of Law. She was a judicial extern for the Alaska Supreme Court and a law clerk for the Alaska Superior Court. Brigette served as a public defender for seven years in New Hampshire and Alaska, representing clients charged with juvenile, misdemeanor and felony offenses and was a deputy clerk of court for the Hillsborough and Merrimack County Superior Courts. She served as assistant dean of student affairs and was the founding director of the Social Justice Institute at Franklin Pierce Law Center (now UNH School of Law).

Hon. David D. King has served as the deputy administrative judge of the NH Circuit Court since it began operations in July 2011. He had previously served as the administrative judge of the New Hampshire Probate Court beginning in January 2007, and had been the presiding judge in the Coos County Probate Court since his appointment in January, 1990. Prior to becoming a full time judge in 2007, he was a partner in the law firm of Waystack & King in Colebrook for 22 years. Judge King is a 1981 graduate of Plymouth State College and received his J.D. from the Franklin Pierce Law Center (now UNH School of Law) in 1984. He previously served two terms on the New Hampshire Bar Association's Board of Governors and is a past president of the Coos County Bar Association. Judge King is a former member of the New Hampshire House of Representatives and was a delegate to the 17th Constitutional Convention in 1984. He has served on a number of non-profit boards, including 23 years on the Board of Directors of the Upper Valley Connecticut Hospital. In 2000 he was named Outstanding Hospital Trustee of the Year by the NH Hospital Association, and in 2005 he was awarded the Vickie M. Bunnell Award for Community Service by the New Hampshire Bar Association.

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
